The web portal will initially be made available to the following geographic markets: USA, CANADA, AUSTRALIA, IRELAND, NEW ZEALAND, SOUTH AFRICA, and the UNITED KINGDOM (England, Scotland, Wales, and Northern Ireland).

"We want to establish a ten (10%) percent reduction in usable items delivered to landfills," says Lambros, who promotes a zero-waste philosophy and direction to voluntary simplicity.
